

The mission of the Jewish Women's Archive is to document the stories of Jewish women, elevate their voices, and inspire them to be agents of change.

Founded in 1996, JWA shares these stories on jwa.org, the world's largest source of information about Jewish women. JWA also hosts public programs, trains the thought leaders of tomorrow, creates original curricula, sparks conversation across multimedia platforms, and is a leading voice in feminist, Jewish, and historical spheres.

Across all our work, on multiple platforms, we were dedicated to amplifying Jewish women's voices, experiences, and accomplishments to provide insight and context for our world today. Story Aperture

JWA was honored to receive a grant from the Covenant Foundation in December 2016 to support **Story Aperture**, a new story-collecting initiative that enables people of all ages to collect and share the untold and underrepresented stories of Jewish women through mobile technology. This initiative builds on JWA's longstanding expertise in oral history and is intended to engage the public as our partner in collecting stories. We began the pilot phase of the initiative in early 2017, developing materials and training diverse cohorts of story collectors. We also partnered with organizations across the country to collect stories from members of their communities.

In January 2017, JWA created #JWAmegaphone: Voices of Power and Protest, a project documenting contemporary activism, and launched it in conjunction with the women's marches across the country. As Jewish women today speak up and take action, just as they have throughout history, JWA is committed to collecting their stories and reflections through this new project. We have received submissions from women ages 16 to 93, sharing their images and words of hope, concern, memory, and action. JWA plans to expand and promote the collection as new waves of activism take place on the national stage.

Rising Voices Fellowship

In 2016-2017, JWA trained its fourth Rising Voices Fellowship (RVF) cohort, a pluralistic group of fourteen young women from across the country. We added new components to the program this year to enhance the program's core work with teens interested in feminism, Judaism, and social justice to strengthen their leadership and to influence the important conversations of the Jewish community. These included training the Fellows to conduct oral history interviews with important women in their lives and to write op-eds or letters to their elected representatives to advocate for change. This year we also launched an RVF alumnae network: as the number of RVF graduates grows, JWA is continuing to nurture these future leaders as they carry what they learned in their fellowship year into college and adulthood. Our RVF graduates represent an important conduit to expanded engagement and conversation with young Jewish women across the country.

Women Rabbis

In Spring 2016, JWA launched **Women Rabbis** in partnership with the Story Archive of Women Rabbis. This extraordinary collection of video interviews with early trailblazers and more recently ordained rabbis tells the story of women breaking the "stained-glass ceiling" and the challenges and blessings they've experienced over the past 40 years. In 2016-2017, JWA developed creative programming around the new collection to highlight its themes of women's leadership and innovation in a traditionally male profession. JWA hosted two public events, in Boston and New York, which drew hundreds of people and sparked conversations about women's leadership in the rabbinate and beyond. In Spring 2017, we also expanded the narrative with a blog series, "Reimagining 'Rabbi,'" in which rabbis and rabbinical students reflect on stories from the exhibit. JWA is excited to add the next group of 25 rabbis to the collection in September 2017.

Education

JWA added lively new programs and resources for educators in 2016-2017, including new lessons about biblical women in the "Girls in Trouble" curriculum, created by educator-musician Alicia Jo Rabins. JWA convened educators for two "Educator Happy Hours," an online meet-up for them to discover community, share ideas, and discuss timely educational issues together. We were also pleased to award the Natalia Twersky Educator Award, which recognizes educators for their creative use of Jewish women's stories and primary sources in their teaching. This year, Yedida Kanfer, Coordinator of Education Services at the JFCS Holocaust Center in San Francisco, and Audrey Abade, Jewish History Department Chair at Magen David Yeshivah High School in Brooklyn, were the winner and finalist, respectively. Podcast

JWA's podcast, Can We Talk?, is a unique collection of audio stories and conversation about Jewish women and the issues that shape their public and private lives. Downloaded tens of thousands of times in its first year by people around the world, Can We Talk? presents timely stories of culture, family, identity, and current events. Over the past year, the podcast has delved into books (banned and beloved), debates over segregation at the Kotel, forgotten chapters of the fight for the Equal Rights Amendment and the women's liberation movement, and more. In keeping with JWA's commitment to capturing history as it is unfolding, the podcast also served as a powerful platform for nuanced exploration of post-election America and Jewish identity, with episodes about the Women's March and Jewish women's multi-generational commitment to activism.

Book Club

With input from members, JWA redesigned its **Book Club** this year to offer an even broader range of features for book lovers. We created new book reviews and interviews with authors, and enhanced our annual recommended reading list ("The Bookshelf") with discussion questions to spark conversation among readers. These offerings, along with a new monthly newsletter, provide context, engagement, and conversation around JWA's featured books. We also held events with authors, including Elissa Altman, Jennifer Brown, Tova Mirvis, Anna Solomon, Marjorie Ingall, Rebecca Traister, and Bonnie Anderson.
